## School Reports - Ron Smyczek (Alyssa Mogensen, Robbi Hughes)

- School Good News:
a. Everyone has been very civil and respectful of each individual family's mask choice, which is very appreciated
b. Enthusiasm of kids and parents has been strong as we start the year


## - Principals Report:

a. Opened at 87 students, up from last year (opened at 79, closed at 86)
b. Two new teachers on staff: Kelly Schisel (3K-4K), Nina Johnson (Kindergarten)
c. We have an aide, Vanessa Bravo, to help with $3 \mathrm{~K}-4 \mathrm{~K}$ due to size of this group
d. Jason Wolf has joined us as our maintenance leader
e. Still searching for a Spanish teacher; there is an online option, while not ideal, we could utilize this if needed
f. Credit to middle school teachers for finding creative ways to intermix middle-school cohorts based on activity, standards, etc. so not all together all the time
g. One positive COVID case so far this year, member of SOTH staff
h. Catholic Identity Theme: Faith in Action. First group activity this week.
i. Academic Theme: Reading. Will cover many different genres.

## Business Reports

- Review and Approve May Meeting Minutes: Approved
- Parent/Parishioner Comments: All
a. Request to look into starting a parent walking group. Concerned about legal requirements. Could they sign a waiver? Ron to have Sandra discuss theoretical with lawyers to determine if any legal issues.
b. Discussed feedback on quality of school events such as Donuts with Dad or Muffins with Mom. How do we create a more inviting atmosphere? Ideas: Have kids make placemats, more food options, table clothes, balloons, etc? Raffle basket giveaway? Take feedback to Home and School committee for future planning.

This is separate from "Free and Reduced Lunch" program that is in place for families in monetary need, but this program is still there for those who will need it in the future.
